Newspapers & magazines, junk mail, office paper, telephone books & catalogues, white envelopes (please remove windows)



plastic bottles

**Plastic BOTTLES ONLY** Please rinse & where possible squash (tops attached)  
Milk bottles, drinks bottle, shampoo bottles, detergent bottles, sauce bottles



food & drink cans

**Food & Drink Cans** Please rinse & where possible squash  
Soup cans, baked beans cans, pet food cans, drinks cans & biscuit tins



foil

**Foil** Please rinse & tie in separate bag  
Kitchen foil, foil trays, foil cartons



aerosols

**Aerosol Cans** Please ensure aerosols are empty

### Red Box - mixed dry recyclables only

✓ **Mixed Glass Bottles and Jars** Please rinse & remove lid / top  
Beverage bottles, jam jars, sauce jars



cardboard

✓ **Cardboard** Individual items no bigger than box lid  
Cereal & egg boxes, corrugated cardboard, shoe boxes, clean frozen food boxes, greeting cards & post cards.



textiles

✓ **Textiles** Please tie in a separate bag  
Clothes, shoes & bedding materials

### Hand Tools

✓ Saws, chisels, hammers, pliers **NO POWER TOOLS**



**Brown Bin - compostable waste only**  
**NO PLASTIC BAGS OR PACKAGING.** Would you consider a home composter to reduce your need for a brown bin?

✓ **Garden Waste** Please prune twigs & branches into short lengths  
Flowers & weeds, grass & leaves, hedge cuttings, plants & shrubs, twigs & branches

From coal, peat or wood fires (these should be placed loose in your bin)

✓ **Food Waste** can be placed into the bin loose, 'lightly wrapped' in a single sheet of newspaper or in food caddy liners provided by the Council. This includes all food wastes such as cooked & uncooked, dairy, fish, bread & pastries, fruit & vegetables, meat & bones & tea & coffee grounds.

**Grey Bin - landfill waste only - Additional bags will only be collected in accordance with the collection calendar.**

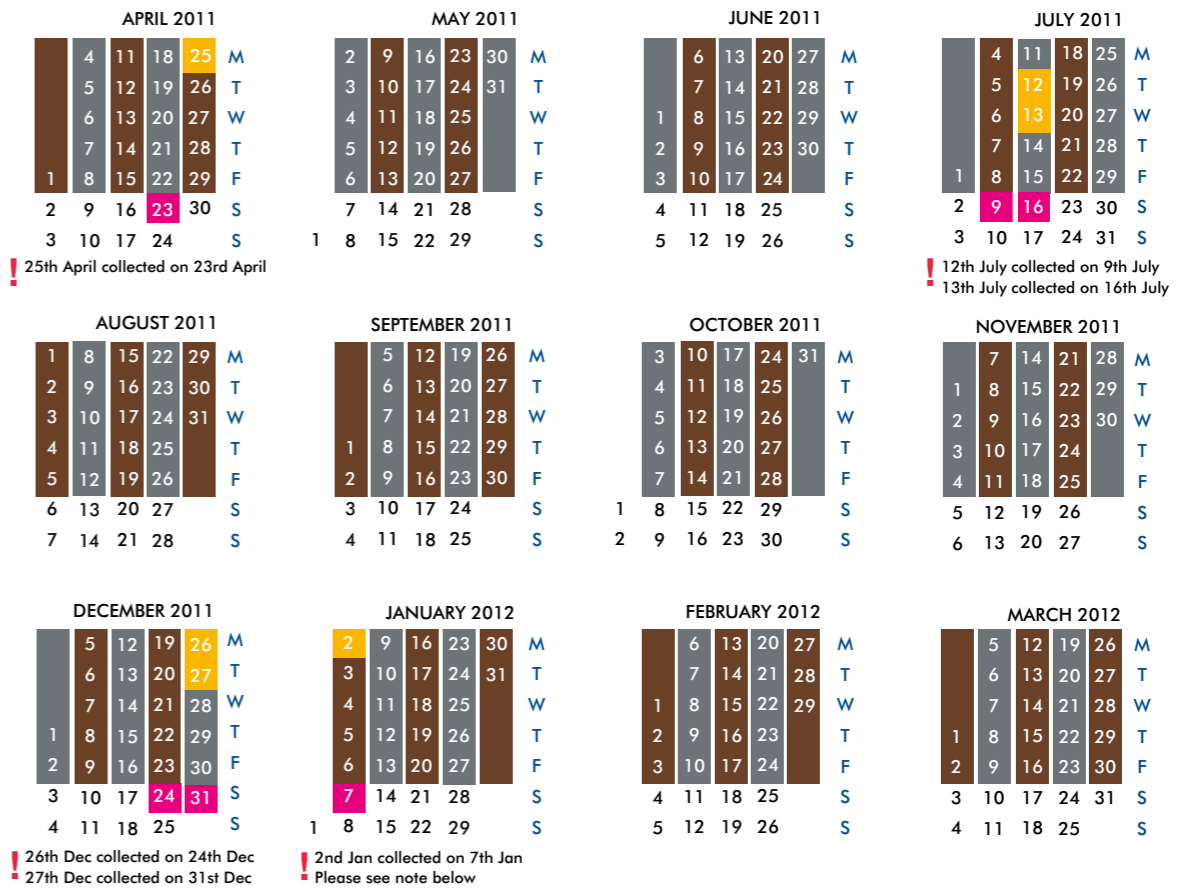

# When are the Collections

**IMPORTANT:** Please read and keep for arrangements during holiday periods

- The collections for your **Brown** and **Grey** bins are given below
- Brown Bins** will only be collected during the weeks highlighted in **Brown**
- Grey Bins** will only be collected during the weeks highlighted in **Grey**
- Please ensure you leave bins out for **7.30am** on weeks indicated (unless otherwise stated)
- If disruption of services takes place due to severe weather conditions, it may be necessary to cancel or reschedule the collection of bins. Please contact Technical & Environmental Services for more information.
- There will be no box collections on the following dates 25 & 26 April, 12 & 13 July and 26 & 27 December. Please save up your extra materials for your next collection using overflow bags if necessary. Bags should contain a single material type only. Please do not put glass in overflow bags.

### Public Holidays Alternative Arrangements (Normal services on all other public holidays)

- Monday 25th April** No collection of bins. Alternative collection on Saturday 23rd April
- Tuesday 12th July** No collection of bins. Alternative collection on Saturday 9th July
- Wednesday 13th July** No collection of bins. Alternative collection on Saturday 16th July (+ 4 extra bags)
- Monday 26th Dec** No collection of bins. Alternative collection on Saturday 24th Dec
- Tuesday 27th Dec** No collection of bins. Alternative collection on Saturday 31st Dec (+ 4 extra bags)
- Monday 2nd Jan** No collection of bins. Alternative collection on Saturday 7th Jan\* (please see note below)

\* No additional bags will be accepted for recycling materials, please make full use of the Council's Community Bring Sites and Household Recycling Centres.

### PLEASE REMEMBER -

- Wheeled bins must be presented at your normal collection point by 7.30am on the day of collection.
- Do not overload your bin. Overloaded bins may not be emptied. It will be the householder's responsibility to lighten the bin for the next scheduled collection.
- The bin lid should be closed. This is for safety reasons & to ensure the contents of your bin do not pollute the area.
- To assist the Council in providing a service, it would be helpful if householders could ensure that their vehicle(s) are not parked in such a manner as to obstruct the refuse collection vehicle. This will reduce the likelihood of disruption to services.

**WARNING - you can be prosecuted for illegal dumping. Please dispose of your waste responsibly.**

**IMPORTANT - CONTAMINATION:** If your brown bin is found to be contaminated i.e. contains unacceptable wastes e.g. plastic bags or packaging, IT WILL NOT BE EMPTIED. It will be the householder's responsibility to remove the contaminant(s) before it is presented for the NEXT SCHEDULED COLLECTION. Contaminated bins can result in a complete lorry load being rejected from the processing facility. This could cost the Council thousands of pounds in additional landfill costs. As part of the monitoring process each bin will be checked for contamination prior to being emptied. Bins found to be contaminated will be clearly marked with an 'OOPS' card and not emptied. In addition to this Council Officers will be carrying out random checks.
